

Founder and president Miriam Fabiancic began her career as a children's book editor at Scholastic in the early 1990s, where she also managed Club de Lectura (currently Club Leo), the first Spanish children's book club in the United States. She specialized in the acquisition of reprint rights for books from foreign publishers.

In 2008 Miriam was named Editor-in-Chief of Club Mosaico, a distributor of Spanish books in the U.S. There, Miriam curated more than 50 catalogs featuring fiction and nonfiction from across the Spanish-speaking world. She commissioned and oversaw the publication of many award-winning titles, introduced new authors to the U.S. market and acquired the best books from domestic and foreign publishers. Miriam has interviewed such distinguished figures as Isabel Allende, Javier Sierra, María Celeste Arrarás, Daisy Martínez, Mariela Dabbah and Jorge Ramos, among others.

She's a frequent contributor on "NotiMujer" on CNN en Español and other media.

Currently she lives in Caracas and New York City. She has also lived in her native Mendoza and in Santo Domingo.
